**March 19, 2004 Governor McGreevey Orders Flags at Half-Staff on One Year Anniversary of Iraq Conflict**

(TRENTON) – In honor of New Jersey National Guard members and reservists who served or are still on active duty in Iraq, Governor James E. McGreevey today ordered the United States and New Jersey flags to fly half-staff on Friday, March 19, the one year anniversary of the start of the Iraqi conflict. “As the one year anniversary of the Iraqi conflict approaches, we thank and remember all of the soldiers who sacrificed their lives to defend freedom and democracy for our nation and the world,” said McGreevey, who will issue an Executive Order to have the flags flown at half-staff. The Governor also will call for a moment of silence at 12:30 p.m. before he speaks at an AARP Town Hall Meeting in Union Township on March 19. He is requesting that members of the public and State Employees join in the moment of silence. “As Governor, I want to thank all the brave men and women of our armed forces and their families, especially those of the New Jersey Army and Air National Guard, for their sacrifices on behalf of our nation and for the honor they bring to our State,” McGreevey said. “Our troops’ mission was to protect, defend and liberate. Their dedication to preserving freedom in Iraq from its tyrant dictator has given the Iraqi people a chance to live a better life.” Over the past 12 months, McGreevey has met with family members of deployed New Jersey National Guard soldiers to discuss and share their experiences about the hardships of having loved ones deployed to Iraq and to explain how programs like the Family Readiness Group can help families cope with these difficulties. The Governor also personally bid farewell to New Jersey troops being deployed overseas and welcomed others back from their tours of duty. “There is no greater joy than seeing a soldier reunited with family,” McGreevey said. “We look forward to the day when all our troops return home safe and sound.”

Soon after, a citizen called 911 to report a fireman at the scene of the fire had been struck by a passenger vehicle. Immediately after the collision, the responsible vehicle fled. Cunha was pronounced dead at the scene. About 30 minutes later, the Gonzales Police Department made an enforcement stop on the responsible driver. The driver is currently charged with vehicular manslaughter and felony hit and run. Cunha had been a member of the Soledad Fire Department since April 1st, 2002. ### **South Carolina Legislature Mulls Half-staff for Military Casualties**

The South Carolina legislature is on the verge of passing a bill mandating that flags fly at half-staff atop the capitol on the day of any serviceman and servicewoman's funeral. INTRODUCED May 27, 2003 H. 4281 Introduced by Rep. WalkerS. Printed 5/27/03--H. Read the first time May 27, 2003. A BILL TO AMEND SECTION 10-1-161, CODE OF LAWS OF SOUTH CAROLINA, 1976, RELATING TO WHEN THE FLAGS ATOP THE STATE CAPITOL BUILDING SHALL BE FLOWN AT HALF-STAFF, SO AS TO PROVIDE THAT THESE FLAGS SHALL BE FLOWN AT HALF-STAFF ON THE DAY WHEN FUNERAL SERVICES ARE CONDUCTED FOR MEMBERS OF THE UNITED STATES MILITARY SERVICES WHO WERE RESIDENTS OF SOUTH CAROLINA AND WHO LOST THEIR LIVES IN THE LINE OF DUTY WHILE IN COMBAT. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of South Carolina: SECTION 1. Section 10-1-161 of the 1976 Code, as added by Act 226 of 2002, is amended by adding a new subsection (D) to read: "(D) In addition to the public officials enumerated in subsection (B), flags atop the state capitol building shall be lowered to half-staff on the day when funeral services are conducted for members of the United States military services who were residents of South Carolina and who lost their lives in the line of duty while in combat." SECTION 2. This act takes effect upon approval by the Governor.

### **SCO Files Copyright Infringement Lawsuit Against AutoZone**

LAS VEGAS, Mar 3, 2004 /PRNewswire-FirstCall via COMTEX/ -- The SCO Group, Inc. (Nasdaq: SCOX), the owner of the UNIX(R) operating system and a leading provider of UNIX-based solutions, today announced it has filed suit against AutoZone, Inc., for its alleged violations of SCO's UNIX copyrights through its use of Linux.

SCO's lawsuit alleges the following:

- \* AutoZone violated SCO's UNIX copyrights by running versions of the Linux operating system that contain code, structure, sequence and/or organization from SCO's proprietary UNIX System V code in violation of SCO's copyrights.

The lawsuit, filed in U.S. District Court in Nevada, requests injunctive relief against AutoZone's further use or copying of any part of SCO's copyrighted materials and also requests damages as a result of AutoZone's infringement in an amount to be proven at trial.

The company will discuss this announcement as part of its regularly scheduled conference call related to first quarter earnings, scheduled for Wednesday, March 3 at 11:00 a.m. Eastern time.
